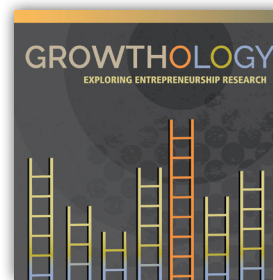

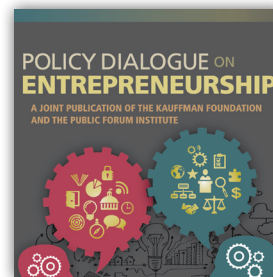
Entrepreneurship Policy Digest

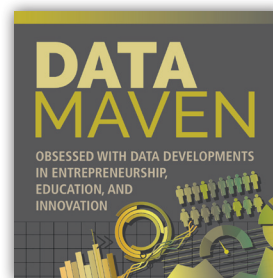

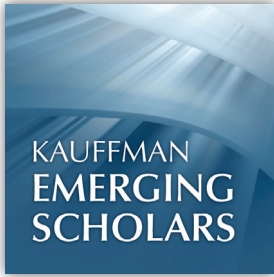


Mayors Conference on Entrepreneurship

This index is the first and largest index tracking entrepreneurship across city, state, and national levels for the United States, and also presents demographic characteristics of the business owners. The 2015 Index covers annual activity from 1996 to 2014.
